

HEERF II Funding

The federal Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021 (CRSSAA) awarded Montefiore School of Nursing a second round of funding under the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II (HEERF II). This \$47,437 in additional funding enabled the college to award our students grants to address continuing disruptions and economic challenges presented by the COVID-19 pandemic, including course materials, technology, health care, childcare, food, and housing.

1. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. Montefiore School of Nursing has been awarded \$47,437 under Section 18004(a)(1) Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students, of which \$47,437 will be provided directly to students impacted by campus disruption due to COVID-19.

2. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of the date of submission (i.e., as of the 30-day Report and every 45 days thereafter).

As of 06/30/2021, a total of \$47,437 has been disbursed to students.

3. The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

The estimated number of students eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 is 129.

4. The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

All eligible students have been offered an emergency Financial Aid Grant under 18004 (a)(1) of the CARES Act. A total of 42 students received funding.

5. The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) along with a completed Emergency Financial Assistance Application must be on file.

6. Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants.

These funds will be designed to prioritize students with the greatest demonstrated financial need. Recipients are required to have a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) on file along with a completed Emergency Financial Assistance Application. The distribution of these funds can be a check or via direct deposit unless a student requests the funds be applied directly to their student account.
